A letter from our General Manager/CEO Kent Schimke

As we transition from the warm and vibrant summer months into the cooler and cozier days of fall, I'm excited to update you on the latest happenings at DRN ReadiTech. Our commitment to you, your communities, and the quality of your experience remains as strong as ever.

Construction Update — Our dedicated teams have been working diligently to upgrade our network infrastructure. I'm pleased to report that our efforts over the summer have yielded positive results. Crews completed 63 plow jobs, including approximately three miles of new duct and fiber to Applied Digital's data center west of Ellendale for redundancy for their service needs and for DRN's network as well. Temporary lines that were laid due to gopher chews have been buried and replaced with protective inner duct in Crete, LaMoure, Verona, and Lisbon. Crews horizontal bored at five different locations to place fiber to new customer installations. Overall, crews completed 32 new construction orders, added over 50 miles of new ducted fiber, completed the transport project from Nelvik to Kulm and have completed approximately 85% of the Lisbon to Horace transport fiber build. There are 28 pending new construction orders that crews will be working on diligently until frost halts construction for the season.

Connected to Community—At DRN ReadiTech, our commitment to our communities extends far beyond simply providing high-speed Internet services. We wholeheartedly believe in the power of community and understand that being actively involved is essential to fostering strong, vibrant neighborhoods.

As we transition into the final quarter of the year, you can count on DRN to remain actively engaged in your community. October is National Cooperative Month, and we are celebrating! I invite you to attend DRN's Annual Meeting on Oct. 19 at the Ellendale Public School. The Annual Meeting is your opportunity to review your cooperative's financials and learn of any new industry updates and developments. Plan to join

DRN is passionate about supporting area youth and is proud to announce it will continue its Scholarship Program in 2024 and will again participate in the Foundation for Rural Services (FRS) Scholarship. Students will need to complete both online applications separately.

High school seniors are eligible if they attend a high school in one of the Cooperative exchanges and/or their parents or guardians are DRN subscribers. Applicants also must plan to attend an accredited college, university or vocational school and indicate an interest in returning to a rural community following graduation to further their career. Students meeting these criteria are encouraged to apply. DRN will also award a scholarship to a student attending the Southeast Regional Career & Technology Center and to a student majoring in business administration at Trinity Bible College (TBC).

Dakota Dirt started
its journey with
friends Wyatt and Landon
Mund and Beau Goolsbey
who all grew up in the
small town of Milnor. The
trio, who played basketball
together and hung out as
friends, always had a desire
to start a business together
but never knew what to do.

A coffee company idea came from drinking coffee that didn't deliver. After experimenting with different roasting techniques in a basement the guys quickly realized "damn that's good coffee" as they like to say at Dakota Dirt.

The name "dirt" is a slang term for a cup of coffee which they incorporated into their company name. The coffee roasted at Dakota Dirt is for the everyday coffee drinker looking for a premium cup of coffee.

The process starts by importing unroasted premium coffee beans. After the beans are roasted, they are then ground, bagged,

and shipped. To ensure coffee freshness, the whole process from start to finish takes less than five days.

Dakota Dirt focuses on the Midwest niche with their names of signature blends tied into dirt or the Midwest. Signature blends include Kickin' up Dust, Frozen Tundra, Flatlander, Buck Fever, 6 Feet Under, and Stick in the Mud. Their coffee isn't limited to but is very tailored to every hardworking Midwest guy or gal who is looking daily for a premium cup of coffee. More coffee options include their single origins roast which are Mexican, Costa Rican, Tanzanian, and Colombian.
