Keeping Americans Connected with broadband built to last

The idea that all Americans should have reliable access to communications services at a reasonable cost has been a national objective for over a century. Today, the federal Universal Service Fund (USF) helps rural Americans connect to high-quality, affordable broadband and supports critical connections for low-income families, schools, libraries and healthcare facilities in rural communities.

Without USF support, it is difficult to make a business case to invest in many rural areas, to sustain networks once they are built, or to keep service rates affordable. According to an August 2024 survey of more than 200 community-based broadband providers across 35 states, the loss of USF support could be catastrophic for rural consumers, efforts to keep investing in broadband deployment, and the viability of existing rural broadband networks.

Respondents reported that rural consumers could see their bills increase by \$72 per month if USF support were eliminated. In addition, 68% of

respondents said they could face the need to cancel deployment projects next year equaling over \$1 billion, representing nearly 80% of these companies' planned broadband investments for 2025.

Even as new broadband deployment programs offer great promise for reaching unserved areas, the USF remains critical to both getting and keeping rural consumers connected to high-quality, affordable services.

Do you know what Internet connection speeds mean?

When you order your Internet package from DRN, you have a few options to choose from. Speed is often the most important factor since a faster Internet connection will improve your overall experience. The challenge is that the fastest Internet speeds are typically the most expensive. That's why it's important to understand how Internet connection speeds work to ensure you select the right package for the needs of your home or business.

How is Internet speed measured? Let's start with the concept of speed, or bandwidth, as it's sometimes called. Measured in Megabits per second (Mbps) or Gigabits per second (Gbps), your Internet speed is the amount of data that can be transferred every second over your Internet connection. Your speed determines the type of activities that you can do online and how quickly you can do them.

A connection speed of 1 Mbps, for example, allows you to browse web pages easily, but it's not fast enough for you to stream HD videos on Netflix. According to Netflix, that requires a minimum connection speed of 5 Mbps. If you tried to stream HD video at 1 Mbps, your video would be poor quality and would likely stutter or pause altogether. On the other hand, a speed of 1 Gbps - one thousand times faster than 1 Mbps - is blazing fast, allowing you to do almost anything, including letting multiple family members stream 4K video simultaneously.

Download vs. Upload Speeds When you are choosing an Internet package, there are two speeds you need to consider: the download speed and then upload speed.

The download speed is the speed at which data travels from a remote location on the Internet to your Internetconnected device. For example, if you are watching a video on YouTube, the download speed is the rate at which the information in the video stream travels from the YouTube server to your computer or phone.

The upload speed, on the other hand, is the speed at which data travels from your connected device to a remote location on the Internet. For example, if you post a video or a photo onto a social media site like Facebook, the upload speed is the rate at which the information travels from your device to the Facebook server.

DRN offers symmetrical speed packages. This means that the download and the upload speeds are the same. But why are download speeds generally faster than upload speeds? Because most of our online activities - like web surfing, video streaming, and application downloads - involve downloading a lot of data. And for certain activities, like online gaming and video streaming, the faster you can download data, the better.

The upload speed may be important to you, depending on the type of activities you plan to do online. If you upload high resolution photos to a photo sharing site. Or, if you work from home, or operate a small business from home, you might also require a faster upload speed.

The bottom line? The speed of your Internet connection has a big impact on the quality of your online experience. So when you're choosing an Internet package, make sure the speeds are fast enough for the kind of activities

Rural Development Finance Corporation GROWING (OMMUNITIES

RDFC PAUSES GRANT PROGRAM FOR 2025

The Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC) board is pausing a grant program for 2025 due to a relatively low available fund balance. Under the grant program in 2024, member electric and broadband cooperatives, NDAREC and the Broadband Association of North Dakota could allocate \$3,000 toward community and non-profit projects within their service areas with approximately \$90,000 in assistance awarded in total.

Next year after the RDFC annual meeting, the board will discuss whether they will reauthorize a grant program for 2026.

The RDFC operates a revolving loan fund, providing low-interest loans for community and small business project in rural areas and towns under 10,000 residents in North Dakota.
